Subject: Public Health Advice

The recent COVID occurrence in Perth has evolved rapidly, and the Victorian Chief Health Officer has released the following important advice.

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The Chief Health Officer has declared the Perth metropolitan area and Peel region in Western Australia red zones (other than for transit) under Victoria's 'traffic light' travel permit system from 2:01am Victorian time on Saturday 24 April.

Victorians in these areas must follow local directions. If they leave to enter Victoria while red zones are in effect, they must quarantine at home for 14 days. If non-Victorians in red zones enter Victoria, they will stay in Hotel Quarantine until a return flight is arranged.

Additionally, if you are currently in Victoria and have been in the Perth metropolitan area and Peel region (other than for transit) between 17 April and 23 April inclusive, you must isolate, get a test within 72 hours, and stay isolated until you receive a negative result.

Victoria has published exposure sites linked to a COVID-19 case. If you were on Qantas Flight 778 from Perth to Melbourne on Wednesday 21 April, you must isolate, get tested, and stay isolated for 14 days regardless of your test result.
